- Support the organisation and delivery of community events
- Promote the project through social media, local press and national press
- Meet agreed priorities and deadlines
- Keep accurate records of activities including produce harvested, and volunteer contribution
- Advise TGC steering group of concerns and opportunities
- Report to Blackhaugh Farm Action Group on a monthly / bi-monthly basis and consult with the group on plans.
- Monitor project spend.

- Experience of community organising and working with volunteers
